PeerNetBC is seeking a Community Developer! We are in search for someone who is committed to peer support, social and economic justice, and community engagement.

Working with our team, the Community Developer will:

- Design and deliver workshops for a variety of diverse communities (topics include: facilitation, peer support, anti-oppression/anti-discrimination, conflict & communication, inclusive leadership, and more)
- Work independently and collaboratively with PeerNetBC team members to develop and deliver community specific projects & programs
- Network with and support community serving agencies and grassroots groups in BC
- Support PeerNetBC projects & programs with data collection, reporting and grant writing
- Recruit, coach, mentor and coordinate facilitators who deliver PeerNetBC workshops throughout BC
- Develop and maintain a community engagement strategy within and outside of PeerNetBC

Ideally, you have experience in community engagement and social justice work, facilitation, workshop design & delivery in a variety of settings, and with Lower Mainland youth and community services. You have also demonstrated through your work and volunteering a commitment to peer support principles and to social change through collaborative action, with an anti-oppression focus. Life experience, desire and interest are all assets! An ability to share your skills is a must!

You will work within a strong value-based culture which embraces and embodies a collaborative approach to working together. Our organization has a busy and varied work environment that requires a strong work ethic.

PeerNetBC values inclusive, accessible, and collaborative processes. We serve diverse communities which include youth and we need a staff group that is reflective of the people we work with. Applicants from diverse backgrounds, with differing abilities are encouraged to apply.

The starting salary is \$43,000 annually (\$23.54/hour) plus benefits.

This position is full-time (35 hours/week) beginning March 1st, 2018 (flexible) until March 31st, 2019. Hours vary and may include evenings and weekends. Depending on funding, this position may be renewed as full-time or part-time.
